MEET THE DIRECTOR:

Dr. Edward Dixon is Director of Bands at Northern Oklahoma College and Instrumental Director of the Roustabouts musical show troupe. He has acted in Regional Actors Community Theatre (ReACT) productions, including



singing the dual title role in *Jekyll & Hyde–The Musical*. His directing credits include *I Love You, You're Perfect, Now Change*; The 25th Annual Putnam County Spelling Bee; The Pirates of Penzance, Mel Brooks' Young Frankenstein, The Last 5 Years and Gentlemen Prefer Blondes and many productions as director of the Evans' Children's Academy of Performing Arts.
